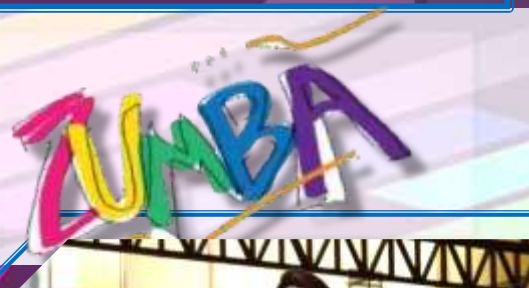
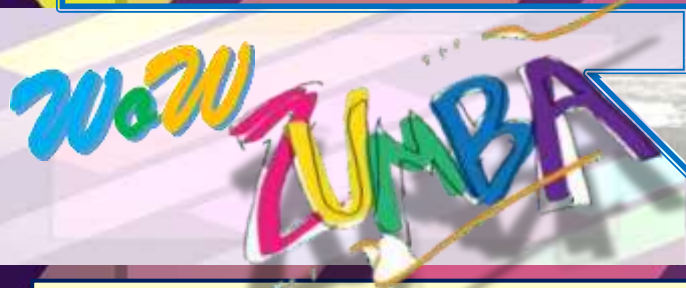

The concept of benchmarking has become significant for library with the recognition that quality management principles and practice provide the means to delivery of effective services in the current climate of increased accountability and dwindling resource. Successful companies have demonstrated that benchmarking can be a useful tool for implementation quality management in the equally demanding operating environment of the business sector.

The model for the benchmarking process was presented as consisting of several stages:

1. Develop understanding of and skill in benchmarking
2. Identify process(es) for benchmarking
3. Aggregate process documentation
4. Identify benchmarking partners
5. Prepare to benchmark
6. Benchmark
7. Implement improvements
8. Improve benchmark process

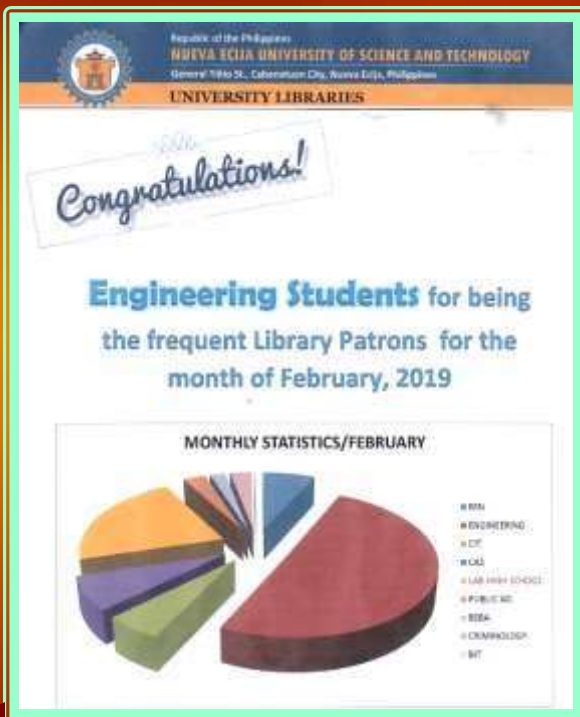

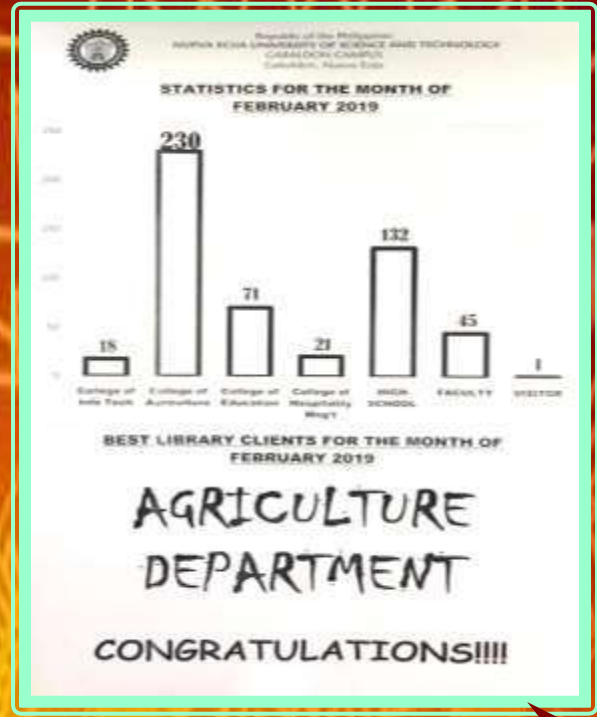

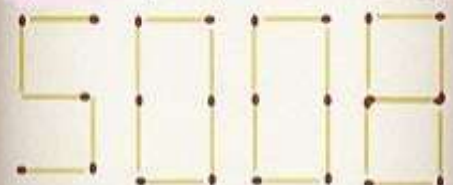

Our very own Gloria Felipe received an award for extraordinary loyalty over many years of service.

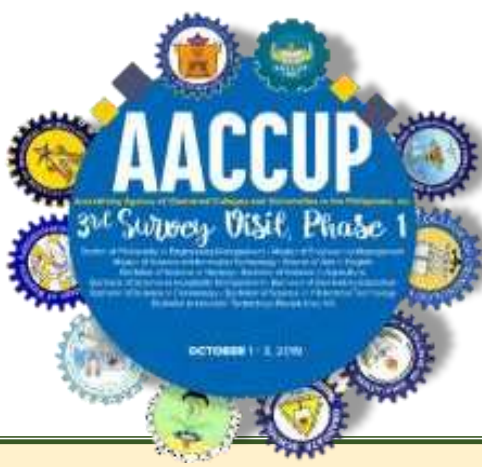

LIBRARY ORIENTATION

Learning how to use different parts of the library can be very complicated! We have put together a virtual library orientation to help you access and use some of the services provided to you. This orientation is offered as a series of digital badges. To start this orientation go to badgesapp.psu.edu and create your profile. From there you can find the Virtual Open House group and join that group. It is group number 64. There are five badges and each one should take you about 25 minutes to do. After completing the activities, you will earn a digital badge that you can share in a variety of ways. Each badge has about 3-5 steps in it. A librarian will personally evaluate your work and give you feedback.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Students will locate the subject guide for their specific course in order to find resources relevant to their field.

2. Students will select a topic and find one book and one article or one popular and one scholarly resource for their paper topic.

3. Students will assess their information to access through borrowing resources/commonwealth

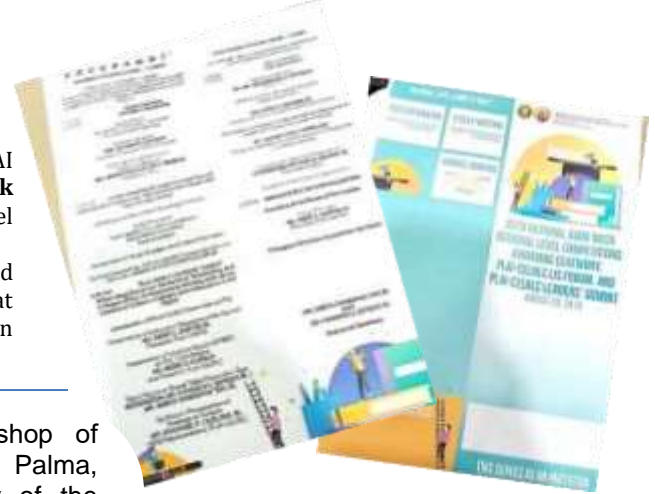
4. Students will be able to identify librarians as resources/experts and contact them for their reference/instruction/and navigational questions in order to forge a connection to the library.

NATIONAL BOOK WEEK

In 1934, in response to the petition of the Philippine Library Association at the time, Governor General Frank Murphy issued a proclamation designating as National Book Week the period extending from June 18 to 24 of every year. This was aimed at arousing the national interest in reading good books and "designed to sell the public library to the community by focusing the attention of the people on its resources and the extent and nature of its services." To ensure greater participation of the public, various libraries and educational institutions, the program of celebration were designed to include the essay and poster contests, book exhibitions, and visits to libraries and printing establishments. In the past, important local newspapers and magazines published contributed articles and messages about National Book Week, and two programs were broadcast over radio.

Prominent men and officials of the Philippine government, such as Governor General Frank Murphy, President Manuel L. Quezon of the Philippine Senate, the most Reverend

Michael O'Doherty, Archbishop of Manila, and Dr. Rafael Palma, President of the University of the Philippines, contributed congratulatory messages for the souvenir program. Judging from the response of the public and from the cooperation given by the leading universities, school libraries, bookstores, printing establishments, and different educational institutions, the idea of a book week was enthusiastically welcomed throughout the country resulting in the recognition of the public library service.

In 1936, Commonwealth President Manuel L. Quezon moved the dates of the annual celebration to November 24-30. In 1937, the Philippine Library Association published and distributed a pamphlet entitled "Book Festival Handbook," a collection of materials and suggested ideas for celebrating Book Week; its purpose was to encourage schools, colleges, universities, and other institutions to participate. It was compiled by Mr. Perfecto S. Sison, who was then the Chairman of the Book Week Committee.

In 1939, the Catholic Church began taking an active part in the observance of the Book Week. The Archbishop of Manila designated the

Sunday Book Week for the observance for all Catholic Churches and enjoined priests to deliver sermons on the value of reading good books. The Bishops likewise enjoined parishes in their respective dioceses to observe the day. Some Protestant churches joined the celebration by holding special programs and exhibits.

Every year, the National Book Week has been observed all over the country with a similar program of activities.

Red

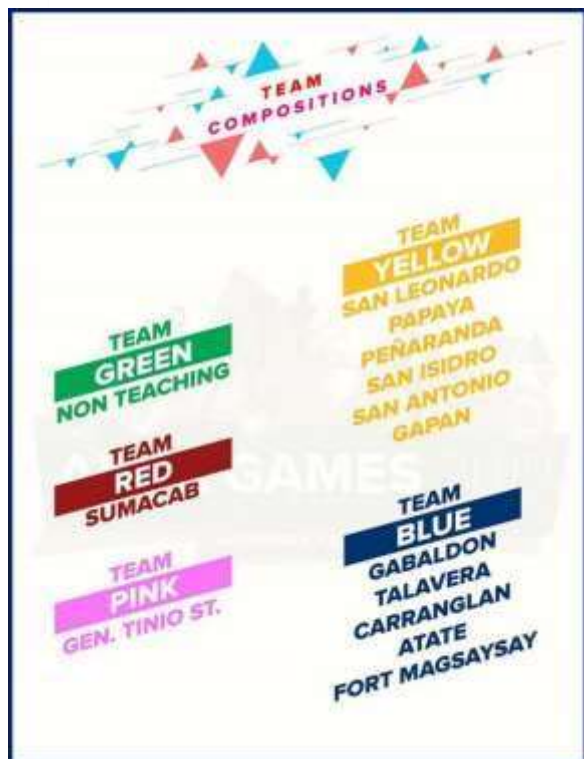

Privacy is essential to the exercise of free speech, free thought, and free association. Lack of privacy and confidentiality chills people's choices, thereby suppressing access to ideas. The possibility of surveillance, whether direct or through access to records of speech, research and exploration, undermines a democratic society. In libraries, the right to privacy is the right to open inquiry w Privacy is essential to the exercise of free speech, free thought, and free association. Lack of privacy and confidentiality chills people's choices, thereby suppressing access to ideas. The possibility of surveillance, whether direct or through access to records of speech, research and exploration, undermines a democratic society. In libraries, the right to privacy is the right to open inquiry without having the subject of one's interest examined or scrutinized by others.



Confidentiality of library records is a core value of librarianship. Confidentiality exists when a library is in possession of personally identifiable information (PII) about users and keeps that information private on their behalf. This includes such library-created records as closed-stack call slips, computer sign-up sheets, registration for equipment or facilities, circulation records, Web sites visited, reserve notices, or research notes. One cannot exercise the right to read in any format if the possible consequences include damage to one's reputation, ostracism from the community or workplace, or criminal penalties. Consider patrons looking for a new job or information about rock climbing or skydiving; this is information that the current employer or insurance company would like to have. Choice requires both a varied selection and the assurance that one's choice is not monitored.



For libraries to flourish as centers for uninhibited access to information, librarians must stand behind their users' right to privacy and freedom of inquiry. Just as people who borrow murder mysteries are unlikely to be murderers, so those seeking information about terrorism are unlikely to be terrorists. Assuming a sinister motive based on library users' reading choices makes no sense and leads to fishing expeditions that both waste precious law enforcement resources and have the potential to chill Americans' inquiry into current events and public affairs.

All parts of the library should constitute settings for people's encounters. The library's entrance space and main space need to appear openly inviting. At the same time, there needs to be a certain span in the signals that are transmitted via interior design and material presentation, so that different user segments feel drawn and inspired to use the library and its offers. The challenge is to create spaces that are flexible and spacious enough to provide room both for quiet concentration and for discussing project groups, for book talks on a stage and boisterous play.
